

In this tutorial you will learn how to a stitch cushion cover



You can give your room a make over just as easy as a pie. Sounds promising, isn't it?

To make a cover that fits one 12" x 12" cushion, you will need – a 13 x 30 inch piece of fabric, beaded pins, threads, a marker and a measuring scale.

For this lesson we have to take a beautiful flowery piece of fabric. Double fold the edge of the shorter side of the fabric and pin in place.

We will first stitch these sides. Turn the Stitch Pattern Selector to A for straight stitches, select stitch length to 2.5, and thread tension to 3.5.

Sew carefully along the folded edge, removing the pins as you sew.

Sew the other edge too.

Next fold the fabric in half with the right sides face to face. Mark 6 inches from the centerfold, as shown.



Connect the marked points with a straight line. Repeat the same on the other side.

Fold along both the marked lines, like this.

There will be a slight overlap, it is meant to hold the cushion in fully.

Pin the overlapped fabric in place.

We will now be sewing along these two open edges... finish off by cutting the extra thread and excess trim.

Take what you just stitched and trimmed back to your machine. Turn the Stitch Selector to C for zig-zag stitch and set stitch length to 1.5. Sew along the both the trimmed edges. This will give the edges strength and a great finish. Now remove the pins and turn the cushion cover inside out.

Wasn't that easy? All you need to do is go to your local wholesale market and scout for interesting fabrics and combinations keeping your interiors in mind. And once you have your bags full you can dip in and begin rethinking your drawing room. Bring home an Usha Janome AZ machine and transform your space.
