











Seer Shorts

If you are looking to stitch some stylish shorts for your toddler, this tutorial is for you.

Material Required

1 meter soft cotton printed fabric of 45" width
Template of the seer shorts which you can download
from our website www.ushasew.com
Scale
1 inch broad elastic
Fancy buttons
Matching thread
Water erasable marker
Scissors
And Pins

In this tutorial you will learn to cut the pieces from the shorts template, sew the crotch area, stitch the inner and side seams, prepare the waistband, insert the elastic and finish the bottom hem.

Step 1: Template Marking and Cutting

Take any bright fabric of your choice. Fold the fabric length wise as shown, so that the non printed side of the fabric faces you. No w we will place the shorts templates downloaded from www.ushasew.com on the fabric. We start with the back template and pin it in place with some beaded pins. Then we will place the front template and pin this in place as well. Once done, we will trace both these templates on the fabric using a marking pen. After tracing, we will unpin the template and cut along the traced lines. Carefully, cut both the pieces out and lay them side to side. You should have four individual pieces.

























Step 2 Stitching the crotch area

Let's sew the crotch area now to join the pieces together.

Take the fabric to your Usha Janome Wonder Stitch Sewing machine. And align the fabric with the edge of the presser foot. Set the stitch selector dial A and stitch length to 2.5. and begin sewing. After an initial few stitches, do a reverse stitch to secure the stitches in place. Proceed further till you reach the end. Cut the thread and similarly sew the crotch section on the back piece. Remember to do reverse stitches at the start and at the end.

Step 3 Stitching the sides and the inner seams to join the two parts together

Your sewn pieces should like this. Now place the front piece over the back piece, right side facing the right side and let's sew the side and the inner seams. Pin the inner seams as shown. Once done, proceed sewing the inner seams, remove the pins as you go. After you are done, cut off the thread and move on to the side seam. Continue sewing till you reach the end. After which move on to the other side, and stitch.

Next on the list is zig zag stitches to avoid fraying of the edges and give the seams a neater finish. Set the pattern selector dial to C and stitch length to 1.5 and sew along the side seams and the inner seams. It might feel like a repetitive process but it's an extremely crucial step.

Step 4 Preparing the waistline and finishing the bottom hem

Turn the shorts inside out and fold the waistline ¼ of an inch and iron over it. Then fold it again by 11/4" and iron again. This will set the fold in place and make it easy to sew. Do this for the entire waistline. The same process will be repeated at the leg hem . Fold in quarter of an inch and iron over the fold. Then fold it again by 1 1/4" and iron again. Do this for both the legs.

Post this, take the fabric to the machine and reset the pattern selector dial to A for straight stitches and stitch





















length to 2.5. Sew over the folds starting with the waistline. Keep a two inch gap on either side of the side seam.

Move on to the leg hems, and sew over the fold. Good job, as you can see we are almost done with the shorts!

Step 5 Attaching the elastic and finishing the waist line

Now, take an elastic band and measure 10 inches for age group 4 to 9 years and 12 Inches for age group 10 to 14 years and cut it. Take a safety pin and attach it to one corner, this will help to secure opposite end of the elastic.

The elastic will be inserted on the back side, this is our back side. Insert the Elastic in the two-inch gap and pass it through the waistband, while doing so ensure that the end of the unpinned side is over the side seam as shown. This has to be locked in place by sewing over it. Remember to use the reverse stitches here at the start as well as the end. Cut the thread and adjust the elastic within the waistband and pull it out through the other two inch gap. Unpin the safety pin and insert the elastic within the waistband again and adjust it in a way that the end of the elastic comes over the side seam. Now sew over it like before. Once done, close the two-inch gap by stitching over it. Repeat this process on the other side as well.

Step 6 Attaching the Buttons
